

Independent Choices

What is Independent Choices?

The Independent Choices program is a Medicaid program administered by the Oregon Department of Human Services. Independent Choices is a flexible program that lets you take charge of your own needs by providing cash benefits for in-home services. The monthly benefit allows you to hire your own service providers and pay them directly.

Who is Eligible?

You must:

- Be eligible for Medicaid long-term services in your home;
- Have had a stable living situation for the past three months as shown by managing your money to meet your food, shelter and personal care needs;
- Have the ability to choose your own service providers and train them to provide the help you need in your own home;
- Pay the service provider for work performed; and

- Maintain a designated bank account separate from your other bank accounts for direct deposit of the Independent Choices cash benefit.

What are the benefits of Independent Choices?

Under traditional Medicaid services:

- You pay DHS for your share of your services, and DHS pays the provider;
- DHS designates the services that must be provided; and
- Your provider must work for the established Medicaid rate.

With Independent Choices:

- You will receive a monthly, direct-deposit cash benefit based on DHS's determination of your service needs;
- You will use that money to pay your service provider directly for your in-home services;



- You are not limited to paying your service provider the established Medicaid rate;
- Your funds in the designated account will not be counted as a resource toward other government or community assistance programs such as Social Security or low income assistance programs; and
- You may have someone else like a family member or friend act as your representative and take on all of the financial, tax and legal obligations.
